SENIOR MAX REPORT

A BREATHTAKING VICTORY FOR HIGGINS



With a last-corner overtaking, Matthew Higgins (Dan Holland Racing) won the third round of the championship. The Brit opened the weekend with the second fastest time in the qualifying practices, behind only Thomas Bearman (KR Sport), but dropped to fifth position in the intermediate standings at the end of the qualifying heats, despite a victory to his credit. Higgins won again in prefinal A and secured third place on the starting grid of the final, behind poleman Bearman and Elia Pappacena (MKC Motorsport). At the start, driver #375 immediately took the lead of the race, but on lap 6 he was forced to give up the lead to Joseph Turney (KR Motorsport) and, shortly after, also second place to Macauley Bishop (Dan Holland Racing). Higgins did not give up and, returning to second place, tried to overtake Turney on the last lap, favouring Jayden Thien (Dan Holland Racing) instead. Turney counterattacked the Dutchman in the final hairpin, but Higgins took the advantage to get back in front and win the race. Turney and Thien got on the podium, ahead of Bishop and Bearman at the finish line.

JUNIOR MAX REPORT

VAN WIJK AT THE LAST BREATH



A heart-stopping final for the Junior MAX class in Franciacorta. Friday's qualifying practices saw Boaz Maximov (Bouvin Power) take pole position ahead of Jacob Ashcroft (Dan Holland Racing), Casper Nissen (RS Competition) and Ties Van Wijk (Bouvin Power), but the standings changed completely at the end of the following qualifying heats: in fact, Nissen gained the lead thanks to two victories and a second place, while behind him were Arjen Kraeling (KR Motorsport) and Scott Marsh (Strawberry Racing); Maximov dropped to fifth, Van Wijk to seventh and Ashcroft to thirteenth. Finally, the two prefinals assigned the first two rows of the final grid to Nissen, Kraeling, Marsh and Van Wijk. At the start of the last race, Nissen made a mistake on the first corner that initially left the field open to Marsh. The latter, after accumulating a good advantage, was joined by Arjen Kraeling and the two began to compete for the lead. The duel allowed various competitors to get closer, including Ashcroft, who started in 26th place. On the penultimate lap, Ashcroft tried to overtake Marsh, but Van Wijk passed both drivers and crossed the finish line first. Ashcroft finished second, while Marsh and lacopo Martinese (KR Motorsport), third and fourth, were penalized, enhancing Maximov, Nissen and Kraeling in the standings.

MINI MAX REPORT

BABICEK EMERGES IN WET CONDITIONS



The first of the two rounds in Italy of the Mini MAX went to Zdenek Babicek (Tepz Racing Team). Initially, the Czech finished 15th in Friday's qualifying practices, where Maxim Becker (C4-Racing) and Albert Friend (Strawberry Racing) stood out, but already at the end of the qualifying heats he had achieved fifth position overall, thanks to a victory and two sixth places. Finally, after the two prefinals won by Friend and Mark Loomets (Energy Corse), Babicek secured the fourth position on the starting grid of the final. The rain changed things in the last race of the weekend: at the start, Oliver Spencer (KR Sport) took the lead, but after a few corners he made an excursion on the grass. Babicek took advantage of the hectic early stages to take the lead in the race and, on a completely wet asphalt, pulled just enough away from his opponents to secure victory. Friend grabbed second place, ahead of Vince Vanderhallen (Bouvin Power), third, and Aj Burggraaff (SP Motorsport), fourth. Becker finished 31st.

DD2 REPORT

SIMONI SURPRISES EVERYONE



Mauro Simoni's victory (Simoni Mauro) was as extraordinary as it was unexpected. The Italian began his weekend in 17th place after the qualifying practice, a session in which Maxim Shchurko (Lenktyniu Linija) and Lenn Nijs (Schepers Racing Service) took the first two positions. Even at the end of the qualifying heats, Simoni remained in the middle of the standings, while Shchurko stayed in the lead with two victories and a fourth place, and then gave it to his rival Nijs due to a disqualification in the prefinal. The final saw Nijs in the lead from the start, chased by Tomas Rudokas (Lenktyniu Linija) and Christensen Frederik Zebis (RS Competition), but on lap 2 light rain made the Franciacorta asphalt slippery. Simoni took advantage of the weather factor and, in a short time, recovered 16 positions and took the lead. On lap 4 there was a real downpour which, in fact, forced the race director to suspend the race. The final resumed after twenty minutes on a completely wet track and Simoni, also thanks to perfect race conduct, flew straight to victory. Paul Fourquemin (Daems Racing Team) and Enzo Bol (SP Motorsport) finished on the podium, while Nijs finished seventh. Shchurko was further behind, in 12th place.

DD2 MASTERS REPORT

PICOT BORDERS ON PERFECTION



In Italy, Nicolas Picot (Picot Nicolas) won for a third time in a row. The Frenchman was the fastest of all in the qualifying practice, thanks to the best time of 49.030 seconds and also preceded everyone in the intermediate standings at the end of the qualifying heats, where he achieved two victories and a fourth place. Finally, the success of the prefinal on Sunday morning confirmed Picot as being first on the starting grid of the final, ahead of Igor Mukhin (Mukhin Igor). When the lights went out, Picot was ahead of Martynas Tankevicius (Lenktyniu Linija), Alessandro Glauser (Glauser Alessandro) and Mukhin, but on the third lap he gave up the lead to Tankevicius. The Latvian barely resisted one lap to the pressure of Picot, but together with Mukhin, in the meantime back in third place, he remained glued to his rival. The chequered flag sanctioned Picot's victory and delivered the second and third positions in the hands, respectively, of Tankevicius and Mukhin. Andreas Brenkusch (KSB Racing Team) took fourth place, ahead of Glauser, who came fifth.

BROUGHAM'S SECOND WIN



Also in Franciacorta it was Spencer Brougham (Brougham Spencer) who climbed on the top step of the podium of the E20, the class reserved for karts equipped with BRP-Rotax electric engines. In the qualifying practice the Briton, by just 8 thousandths of a second, came close to pole position, which went to Raul Vargas (S.L.K. Racing Academy). The Englishman took his revenge in the following qualifying heats, in which he won twice and achieved a second place, results that allowed him to take the lead in the intermediate standings, ahead of Will Elswood (Elswood Will), Balazs Totis (Totis Balazs), Griffin Dowler (Dowler Griffin), Vargas and Yanek Sterzel (Sterzel Yanek). Brougham also won the prefinal on Sunday morning, while in the final in the afternoon he had to give up the lead to his rival Totis during the first laps. On the penultimate lap, the British driver returned to lead the race and, in the sprint, preceded Elswood, Totis, Vargas and Dowler. At the end of the post-race technical checks, the standings saw Brougham in first position, with Totis and Vargas second and third respectively. Elswood, Dowler and Sterzel complete the final standings.




